








ROMANIA, 14-20 MARCH 2016. STUDENTS MEETING IN CRAIOVA
MEMORIES FROM THE JOURNEY



Day 1. Monday
For most of us it was the first flight in a lifetime. So we were very excited. We landed in Bucharest at 2.15 p.m. In the capital of Romania we went for a short walk. We saw the Nicolae Ceaușescu's (a communist dictator) residence, the seat of the Parliament now. And we visited... a playground. Time has passed very quickly and finally we met our partners from Italy! Our travel to Craiova took more than 4 hours and the kids were singing continually for three of them starting from „Volare, ooo, cantare oooo!”. We finally got to the place before midnight. Our Romanian partners welcomed us with flowers...



Day 2. Tuesday
Every day was reach of activities. Of course we started with visiting the school. It's a huge complex of blocks. We've met the headmaster and the Romanian team. Their class register is really impressive! Our first lesson was about Healthy Life& Nutrition and what disturbs and helps the brain. We saw a chicken's liver after a few days in coca-cola. It was a horrible view and... a smell too. Later we went to the Botanical Garden and in the center of the town Craiova and we saw that in Romania spring comes faster! After lunch in the cantina pupils were solving the tests of Multiple Intelligences and went back homes. The day ended with a pleasant and cheerful dinner.



Day 3. Wednesday
In the morning in a beautiful House of Culture we've watched the film Animal Games. Students, working in the international groups, had to guess which animal will win in high jump or swimming etc. During the discussion after the film about recognizing and developing of talents the pupils have created a fantastic motto than everyone should use in a difficult moments: ***There is always a solution. Find it!*** After coffee/tea break with delicious snacks and sweets made every day by Romanian parents, each student has started preparing a personal Journal of the Project using scrapbooking technique. While in the afternoon at school students have created three Board Games about brain: *Jumping Neurons*, *Twist your brain* and *Wheel of brain*. In the evening they were with families.





Dzień 4. Czwartek

Od rana odbyła się lekcja geografii na temat systemu słonecznego z użyciem mnemotechnik i radami o robieniu notatek. Mieliśmy też świetne zajęcia w szkolnym ogrodzie, żeby zapamiętać swoje imiona. Druga część zajęć odbyła się w Planetarium w Museum of Natural Science. Dzień 5. Piątek

Kolejny intensywny dzień rozpoczął się warsztatami informatycznymi (uczniowie poznali program Photo Story) i grami interaktywnymi. Do Liceul "Matei Basarab" przyjechała też lokalna telewizja i przygotowała reportaż o naszych działaniach w ramach Erasmus+. Wzięliśmy też udział w Międzykulturowych Zajęciach Folklorystycznych przygotowanych przez małych uczniów z rumuńskiej szkoły z tańcami, śpiewem i recytacją. Po zakończeniu ich występu polska ekipa spontanicznie zaprezentowała energetyczny taniec. To samo zrobili Włosi – Ludovica nawet zagrała na tamburynie! A to był dopiero początek wspólnych tańców.... Nasza grupa Erasmus+ jeszcze długo na boisku szkolnym tańczyła albo grała w piłkę nożną/siatkówkę. Ostatnie zadanie, czyli opracowanie ulotki ABC mózgu, poszło szybko. Wieczorem spotkaliśmy się w Liceul po raz ostatni na Tradycyjnej Kolacji Pożegnalnej.

After a week of holiday, we came back to school for the second semester. In other words a new beginning...



From the 14th to the 20th of March 2016 ten students from the Secondary School of Muro Leccese, accompanied by headteacher Ms Antonella Corvaglia and teacher Ms Maria Giuseppina Accoto, took part in the first meeting of the Erasmus project “Brains at school - Knowledge is power”.

The meeting was held in Craiova, a town in Romania and involved twelve Romanian students from Liceul Matei Basarab and eleven Polish students from Gimnazjum School in Mosine, Poland. Italian and Polish students were hosted within twelve Romanian families who have shown willingness to welcome them.

The Italian, Romanian and Polish teachers had dedicated the months before their departure to organise and prepare the activities the students have played during the meeting. Among all the activities, students enjoyed the Multiple Intelligence Test very much. They found very interesting the interpretation of the results given by the Romanian psychologist. The following are some of the comments made: “I discovered some aspects of my character that I ignored before”, “The test helped me become even more aware of my strengths and weaknesses”.

Particularly engaging was the Friday morning activity when the students have been able to share the typical aspects of their respective cultures through dances and folk music. Later, they described it as a really gripping and enjoyable activity. “It's true, as our grandparents used to say, that “Pizzica” can really shake anyone”, “It was so exciting to see students from other countries trying to imitate the way we moved to the rhythm of Pizzica”, Enrica and Anna Chiara said.

All the students agree that the meeting was an extremely educational experience, because it was not only an occasion to use and improve English as means of communication, but it also enriched their cultural background allowing them to come into contact with other languages, cultures and religious traditions and therefore expanding their horizons.

Finally, this alternative educational experience has created a special feeling among the students, thanks to the warm hospitality of the Romanian host families to which we send our warm greetings and heartfelt thanks.
